Incoming WATS Line for Ministers' Use

For many years we have used the 800-423-4464 number for quick turnaround of messages for ministers who wish to be connected to various offices on campus. We have also at various times used this number for special projects; i.e. festival advisors calling in, etc.

Unfortunately, the number is becoming widely known as a result of some giving it out indiscriminately. If this practice continues, the number will need to be changed, which our Communications Department would prefer not doing at this time.

International News

French Department Report For two years now a large part of our magazines and brochures sent to Africa have not reached the subscribers, or they reached them very irregularly and with great delay. This is due principally to the post office's system of forwarding which is very inefficient. Mr. Apartian has been forced to temporarily stop all mail to the African Continent. Only members and co-workers will receive our publications by special air mail courier.

We had a record attendance of 165 persons in Quebec City for Pentecost 1981. Another record attendance was in Guadeloupe in the Caribbean, with 103 present for Pentecost. Services were held approximately one half mile from the volcano "Soufriere."

In his last correspondence from Guadeloupe, dated June 1st, pastor Erick Dubois writes: "The shipments containing the brochures and Bible Correspondence Course lessons have arrived. However, airport controls are very tight. They opened the four packages and took a sample copy of each brochure. Likewise for La Pure Verite (Plain Truth) this month. If only they could profit from their reading...!"

<u>Dutch-speaking Area</u> The highlight of the month of May was the beginning of a new church in the city of Zwolle, located in the northern part of the country.

God's Work in The Netherlands now has three churches. One church in Tilburg serving the Dutch-speaking Belgian brethren and the brethren from the southern provinces of The Netherlands; a second church in Bilthoven serving the Utrecht area and western provinces; and the third church in Zwolle serving the eastern and northern provinces. Attendance is quite evenly spread out over the three churches, with each having an average attendance of 87.

Anyone visiting The Netherlands and interested in attending a Dutchlanguage service with simultaneous English translation should contact our office in Utrecht by calling 030-317117 for proper time and location.

Church attendance is up 35% so far this year, and income is up 32% over 1980 year-to-date.

AMBASSADOR COLLEGE UPDATE

The summer session of classes is now under way. Also, we have a number of Continuing Education classes which are designed primarily for local church members who wish to take a few noncredit classes at Ambassador.

We are expecting the arrival of about 70 Japanese students (plus chaperons) on July 20th. They will be here on campus taking classes in English, American History, etc., and will do some touring in the area from July 20th through August 11th.

Mr. Richard Paige will once again serve as Director of the A.C. "Big Dig" in Jerusalem this summer. The students will leave for Jerusalem on Wednesday, June 24th. About 40 will participate in the Big Dig adventure this summer,

including Mr. and Mrs. Paige and their daughter. The Israelis have really appreciated the very fine example and the good work done by our students in the past. I am sure we shall, once again, receive very good reports concerning the coming summer's digging in Jerusalem. The diggers are scheduled to arrive back in the U.S. on Wednesday, August 12th--shortly before the 1981-1982 college year begins.

PUBLISHING SERVICES UPDATE

The redesign and reprinting of some of the Work's basic books is moving along very well. Two of Mr. Herbert Armstrong's books and the Bible Story series are presently in various stages of completion. The new paperback version of THE MISSING DIMENSION IN SEX, published by the Church (not for sale), is now available. The book is currently being mailed out in new style protective cartons to the 200,862 people who have requested it both in the U.S. and overseas since it was offered by Mr. Armstrong last year. Church pastors should have received an advance copy in the mail by now.

The new paperback version of THE INCREDIBLE HUMAN POTENTIAL, also published by the Church, is now being printed. We expect delivery in early July. Both of these new "paperbacks" are in our 5½ x 8½ regular booklet size and are intended to be used to fulfill needs created by our church promotions via Mr. Armstrong's ads, TV or PT/GN ads.

The newly redesigned Volume I of the four or five volume set of the Bible Story is in its final stages of production prior to going to one of the largest book printers in the world, the Arcata plant in Kingsport, Tennessee. Plans call for completed books of Volume I to be distributed at the Feast of Tabernacles. An advance copy of each volume will be sent first-class to all church pastors soon after production is completed on each one.

ON THE WORLD SCENE

FRANCE: COMMUNISTS IN; POLAND: RUSSIANS STILL HESITATE Europe, both East and West, is in a state of dynamic tension. In France, Socialist President Francois Mitterrand has brought Communist ministers into the French government for the first time since 1947. Four Communists will hold four relatively minor, non-security related posts out of 43 portfolios. The move was surprising in that Mitterrand's Socialists won a clear majority in the parliamentary elections of June 14 and 21, and thus did not require

Communist help to govern. The Communists lost heavily in the elections, as they did in the earlier presidential vote that swept Mitterrand into office.

Mitterrand's Gallic logic seems to be this: Throw a few crumbs to the Communists now while they are weak and submissive. The Communists were forced to accept Socialist conditions on key issues—even criticism of the Soviet move into Afghanistan—in order to get the government posts. Mitterrand also believes he has bought labor peace since Communists control France's largest labor federation.

Nevertheless, Mitterrand's surprise action has raised eyebrows in Washington, London and elsewhere. It is the first time that Communists have been in a NATO government since the alliance was founded in 1949 (with the exception of brief periods of time in Iceland).

Communist power-sharing in France creates a precedent for Italy and Spain, where Communists are also scrambling for places in government. The move could thus accelerate Western Europe's gradual drift away from U.S. dominance of the Western alliance.

It is virtually certain that France will be dominated by the left for a considerable period of time. Mitterrand is in office for seven years, the new National Assembly for five. During this time, the Socialists are certain to redistrict French representation in their favor, reducing the proportional strength of the rural, more conservative parts of the country. All major trends in French society--urbanization, the rising number of salaried workers, growth of the service sector, the steady flow of women into the work force--favors the Socialist/leftist cause.

Meanwhile, in Eastern Europe, political observers are becoming increasingly jittery over the possibility of a Soviet move into Poland. Moscow fears that reformers within Poland's rulership will win out completely over pro-Soviet hardliners at next month's Communist Party congress.

The Red Army's move into Czechoslovakia in 1968 occurred right before that country's party congress would have formalized the "Prague Spring" as official policy. The Polish Communist bosses, similar to their Czech counterparts 13 years ago, have been attacked very harshly, in biting communiques, by the central committee of the Soviet Communist Party.

Still, the average Pole is worried more about his rapidly declining standard of living than the threat of Soviet intervention. Shortages of nearly everything prevail. Butter, flour, rice, sugar and most meat are rationed. Milk is unavailable after 7:00 a.m. (lines form at food shops from 5:30 on). The list of goods either unavailable or difficult to come by lengthens every day. It includes gasoline, vodka, cheese and cigarettes. Shoe polish, shampoo and chocolate have long been unavailable.

The Soviets, despite their increasingly more strident threats, are still reluctant to intervene directly. Said one observer: "No one lightly begins a war with a nation as large and as tenacious as Poland and that is what the Soviet Union risks."

Meanwhile, what, if anything, has Poland's native son, Pope John Paul II been doing during the mounting Polish crisis? Apparently quite a bit, behind the scenes at least. According to Bernard D. Kaplan of the Hearst

News Service, "Pope John Paul II has been conducting confidential and direct talks with the Kremlin over the future of Poland."

Mr. Kaplan reports that according to "usually reliable sources" in the French Catholic episcopate, John Paul II intervened personally and through his secretary of state Cardinal Casaroli, to seek to dissuade the Soviets from using their armed might to crush the Polish reform movement earlier in the year.

"The Pontiff," reports Mr. Kaplan in the Los Angeles Herald Examiner, Sunday, April 26, 1981, "frequently has made known his deep concern over the crisis in his homeland. However, this is the first indication that he has assumed a personal role in it. It is also the first report that the Vatican and the Soviet government have entered into direct political negotiations with one another. Informants here said there was 'no way of knowing' whether the pope's involvement had influenced the Russians' apparent decision not to use force against the independent trade union movement, Solidarity.... What seems clear, nevertheless, is that Pope John Paul decided to throw the overall psychological and political weight of the Catholic Church into the balance to try to preserve Poland from Soviet invasion."

Kaplan quotes a Catholic source as saying that the Soviets "have made it apparent on many occasions that they want the Vatican's good will and cooperation as far as possible throughout those portions of Eastern Europe where the Church's spiritual and social roles are significant. Brutal action in Poland would destroy the improved relations that have been built up during the past decade or so. That improvement has served both sides well... Pope John Paul has been convinced for some time that the Soviet leadership has a healthy respect for the church's deep-seated influence."

The belief in church circles, adds Kaplan, is that, although the pontiff's action may not have been decisive in itself, it was among the factors that led the Kremlin to decide against immediate intervention sometime during the last week in March and the first week in April.

Informants believe, concluded Kaplan, that the Kremlin's interest in a long-term understanding with the Vatican stems from Catholic fervor in the Soviet-ruled Baltic states, especially Lithuania, which are adjacent to Poland.
